National Junior Beta Club offers students another way to demonstrate their dedication to academic excellence, character building, leadership development and of course service involvement. This is a nationally recognized organization that requires a **one-time fee of \$24** that will be billed through FACTS and **FIRST TIME MEMBERS** will receive a certificate and pin at the end of the year. Certificates and pins will not be given out yearly to returning members. Please read through the information carefully and if you have any questions, please don't hesitate to reach out! Most if not all agencies are allowing volunteers into their facilities. Some may be in decreased numbers, so please plan ahead for your students to volunteer. Before arriving at an agency, please read the volunteer page of their website to familiarize yourself with the policies and guidelines. The POP website has endless resources on sites to volunteer at, so be sure to check it out. There are numerous opportunities available!

Please read the important information below that pertains to Beta Club. It will be sent to the Beta Club students after the new school year begins.

- Each student that is a member of Beta Club should pursue service opportunities on their own and will be responsible for documenting hours performed. There are 2 separate forms of documentation that the students will be responsible for keeping track of. Please see the requirements below.
  - **Form #1** - Students will log their hours in the [Beta Club Service Hours form](#). This is an **online google form and will be sent to all students in Beta Club. It will also be accessible on our website under Community Service. All hours need to be submitted once the service is complete. Please do not wait until the end of the year to try and remember what service you have completed.**
  - **Form #2** - Each student will also be required to take a [POP Beta Club Verification form](#) to all agencies/organizations they volunteer at. This form is to validate the service performed and must be signed by a Site Coordinator. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** After the student has the form completed by the Site Coordinator, they need to bring the form to my office for my signature. They are also welcome to leave it at the front office for me.
  - A student's service is **NOT** complete until they have followed all steps listed above.
- All Beta Club service hours are eligible from **August 2023- May 2024.**
- **A MINIMUM of 10 hours is required for the current school year.** Students are encouraged to serve 10+ hours! Please see the details below relating to hours that are accepted.
- **Quarterly meetings will be scheduled by the Christian Service Coordinator and will be conducted during school hours.**
- **RAK experiences DO NOT count towards Beta Club Service hours. RAK & Beta Club are two separate organizations and cannot be combined.**

 **8<sup>th</sup> Grade Families – Confirmation service events that are required for Confirmation DO NOT count towards Beta Club.**

➡➡➡ All Beta Club students are required to volunteer at a minimum of 3 philanthropies/agencies for a cumulative total of 10 hours.

➡➡➡ All Beta Club students are required to send photos from their hours of service to [tbayo@popschool.net](mailto:tbayo@popschool.net).

➡➡➡ All Beta Club students can attend a scheduled Serviam Night @ POP and record 2 hours of service. Serviam nights are scheduled 1 per quarter and students are allowed to record ONE Serviam Night for the school year.

🌟🌟 New this year – A Virtual hour will not be accepted. All agencies and sites are open and welcoming volunteers.

### 👉 WHAT COUNTS AS SERVICE? 👈

Beta Club students are encouraged to serve in a manner that fosters a relationship with Christ through encounters with the poor, vulnerable, and marginalized in our surrounding communities. This does include animals. **Please go over the examples below with your students on what qualifies for service hours. It is very important that all students and parents understand this before submitting hours. If there are hours submitted that do not qualify, the student and parent will be notified, and those hours will need to be made up.**
